Remove Barriers to Colorectal Cancer Screening

COLORECTAL CANCER COSTS TOO MUCH

BUT MEDICARE PATIENTS FACE UNFAIR FEES



If a polyp is removed during a colonoscopy screening, seniors face paying high coinsurance fees because the billing code changes under current Medicare policies.

Under the ACA, private health plans can't impose cost sharing when a polyp is removed.⁵ This policy should also apply to Medicare.

WHAT CAN CONGRESS DO?

COSPONSOR AND PASS THE REMOVING BARRIERS TO COLORECTAL CANCER SCREENING ACT (S. 624, H.R. 1220)



Reduce the financial burden on patients by covering the cost of colorectal cancer screening and polyp removal under Medicare part B



Increase colonoscopy screening rates among the Medicare population – especially among men with lower income and levels of education






